✓ ROAD (Directory of Open Access scholarly Resources)

The ROAD database collects, among other things, open-access scholarly resources that have independent registration. Opus et Educatio is listed here. portal.issn.org

✓ OPENALEX

This is a broad, open-access scholarly publication and resource indexing system (multi-million database), in which Opus et Educatio can also be found. portal.issn.org

✓ Crossref

The journal is also registered in Crossref, so the articles have DOI numbers, and the reference data is also available there. portal.issn.org

✓ FATCAT, Wikidata

Further, large international data repositories where the journal has received a bibliographic description are listed: FATCAT and Wikidata. portal.issn.org

✓ EPA / Electronic Periodical Archive (Hungarian National Széchenyi Library)

A domestic digital archive where the full content of Opus et Educatio is available and searchable. Epa.oszk.hu

Up for debate!

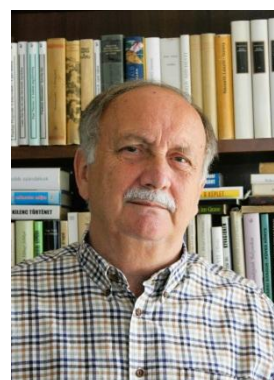

Prof. Dr. Yoo Jinil is a researcher of Hungarian literature and Hungarian studies, a professor and administrative director of the Hankuk University of Foreign Studies, and the head of the Hungarian Department. He regularly teaches employees and regional experts of the Samsung Group. He holds a doctorate in Hungarian literature and habilitation from Eötvös Loránd University. He is a member of the Hungarian Writers' Association.
