

Our website has been expanded with new elements

In connection with the developments and qualification procedures already indicated in our last April Newsletter (for example, the MTA MTMT journal qualification process), the **Opus et Educatio** website has been expanded with new information. Among these, we would like to point out that in accordance with the **Open Access** principle and the definition formulated by DOAJ (What does DOAJ define as Open Access? – DOAJ Blog), **Opus et Educatio** is an open-access journal, all of whose content is freely accessible to the user or their institution.

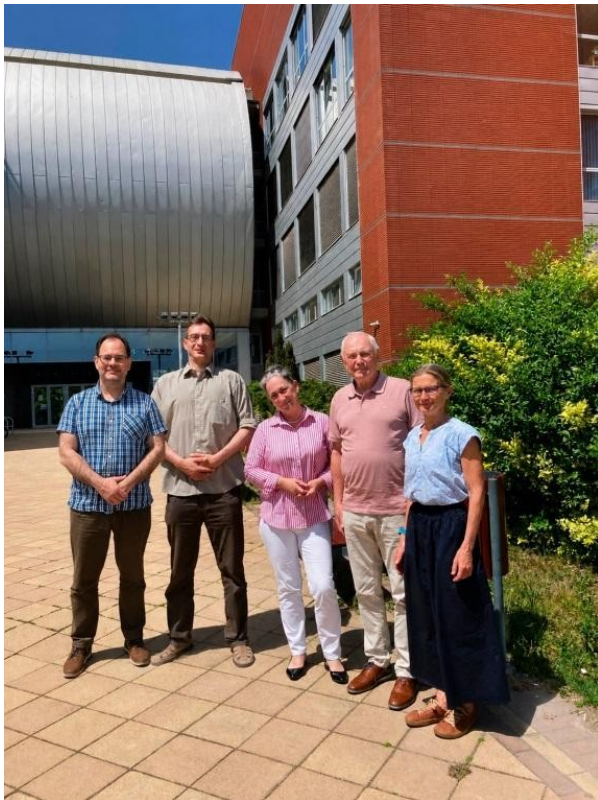
The **Opus et Educatio** provides access to its content on the principle that making research freely available to the public promotes global knowledge exchange. Another important element in the acceptance, evaluation, and editing of manuscripts is that the statement regarding the artificial intelligence used by the authors is that “During the preparation of the manuscript, the authors used an AI application to improve the readability and language of the text. After using the service/tool, the authors reviewed and edited the content as necessary, and took full responsibility for the content of the publication.” According to the position of our editorial board, the use of AI tools for writing, criticizing/evaluating publications is not allowed.
